## Swanson's Bill To Enable Emergency Responders To Cast Provisional Ballots Passes Assembly Floor Unanimously

**(Sacramento)** – A bill to allow firefighters, paramedics, and other emergency responders cast provisional ballots anywhere in the state during a declared state of emergency cleared the Assembly floor today. AB 1440, authored by Assemblymember Sandré R. Swanson (D-Alameda), passed the Assembly Floor yesterday on a bi-partisan unanimous vote of 65 – 0.

“Emergency responders can be sent off to a far corner of the state at a moment’s notice to battle destructive wildfires, rescue people from the after-effects of mudslides, earthquakes, or other natural disasters, with little or no ability to cast their vote during election season. Their obligations to ensure the safety of California’s citizens during an emergency should not deprive them of their fundamental right to vote. AB 1440 will address this situation,” Assemblymember Swanson stated.

AB 1440 will allow emergency responders sent out of their home county on a state of emergency to cast a provisional ballot, regardless of where they are working in the state. Vote selections will be counted only for those races that the individual would be eligible to vote on according to their registered address.

"When disaster strikes, firefighters and other first responders have to drop everything. This bill ensures emergency personnel don't also have to surrender their right to vote when they answer the call to help their fellow Californians," said California Secretary of State Debra Bowen, the State's chief elections officer.

Assemblymember Swanson concluded, “A person’s right to vote should not be compromised by the call to duty. This bill will ensure that our emergency responders, who put their lives on the line to protect Californians, will be able to exercise their constitutional right, regardless of where they are called to service.”

The bill now heads to the Senate, where it will be heard in the Elections, Reapportionment and Constitutional Amendments Committee.
